- Administration of oxygen, oral glucose and activated charcoal.
- Reassuring patients and bystanders by working in a confident, efficient manner.
- Avoiding mishandling and undue haste while working expeditiously to accomplish the task.
- Placing it in the ambulance and seeing that the patient and stretcher are secured
- Continuing emergency medical care while enroute to the medical facility.
- Constantly assessed the patient enroute to the emergency facility, administers additional care as indicated or directed by medical control
- Assists in lifting and carrying the patient out of the ambulance and into the receiving medical facility
- Reports verbally and in writing, the observation and emergency medical care of the patient at the emergency scene and in transit, to the receiving medical facility staff for purposes of records and diagnostic procedures
- Cleans all equipment following appropriate disinfecting procedures,
- Makes careful check of all equipment so that the ambulance is ready for the next run
- Maintains ambulance in efficient operating condition



The Zamboanga City Medical Center started as a General Hospital on September 01, 1918. In 1962, the hospital was designated as the training hospital for Region 7. Thereafter it was renamed as Zamboanga Regional Training Hospital for Region IX, On March 24, 1992, through the Republic Act No. 7270, the hospital was converted to Zamboanga City Medical Center, upgrading it from 200 to 250 bed capacity hospital, Through this mandate,

Zamboanga City Medical Center became the principal hospital facility of Zamboanga Peninsula. ZCMC is under the jurisdiction of the Department of Health (DOH) which is the authorized body to organize the management and administration of the hospital.

Hospital Description

- Responds to emergency situations
- Receive and respond to emergency calls to all types of patients: Trauma, Medical, Pedia and Ob-gyne with a semi-fully equipped ambulance
- Provides basic life support, conserve life and alleviate suffering
- Uses and maintains common emergency equipment
- Providing emergency medical care of simple and multiple system traumas such as:
- Controlling bleeding/hemorrhage
- Bandaging Wounds
- Manual Stabilizing injured extremities
- Splinting of the fractured extremities and other body parts
- Do patient assessment in a systematic approach to collect related information about the patient's injuries or illness as well as historical information.
- Evaluate the status of the patient and provide appropriate treatment this may include airway management, bandaging and splinting for fracture, short and long board immobilization for patients who has possible spinal injury, CPR for Cardiac and unconscious patients and treatment for shock
- Render emergency medical care to Adults, Children, and Infants based on assessment findings. Duties

- Opening and Maintaining an Airway
- Ventilating patients
- Administering Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation
- Assisting in Child birth
- Facilitates and evaluates Basic Life Support Trainings and seminars conducted by the organization


